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WHAT IS A CHC?

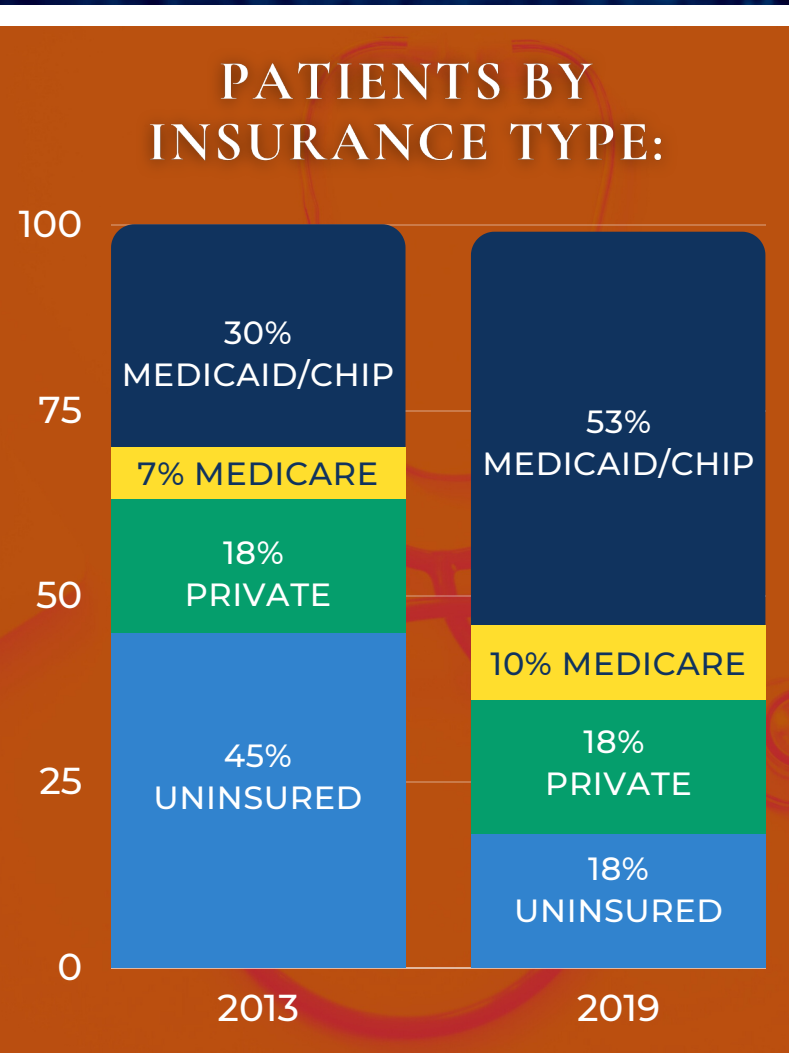
Community Health Centers are non-profit organizations which are required to:

- Provide care to an area or population that has limited access due to insurance type or eligibility and/or because there are few other providers serving the area/population
- Accept all patients, regardless of ability to pay, and offer services on a sliding fee scale
- Be governed by a Board comprised of at least 51% health center patients

WHO DID NEVADA'S CHC'S SERVE?

In 2019 Nevada's CHC's served 107,480 patients, including:

Demographic	Percentage
67% were racial or ethnic minorities	67%
93% have income below 200% of the federal poverty level	93%
31% 18 & under	31%
9% 65+	9%
57% were female	57%



HOW DO CHC'S SERVE NEVADANS?

There are 39 CHC's based in the state & 2 out-of-state CHC operating 41 sites statewide.
